County Councillor R Hosking

Works at Gibb have been postponed DCC saved £850,000 by using LED bulbs

It will take 6 - 8 weeks for the works to be completed on the road from Wonwell to Ramsland, awaiting information on the diversion routes.

(b) County Councillor and District Councillor's Reports (continued)

District Councillor I Blackler was not present, but provided the following report:

The T 18 restructuring at SHDC has been completed.

The Chief Executive at the council is Sophie Hosking.

During this year from my Locality Fund I have given to Holbeton, Newton and Noss, Yealmpton, The Ring and Ride and Sparkwell various grants of about £500 and finally £470 to the Dementia Project.

Council Tax will increase by £5.

The Council are permitted to borrow £60m for investment purposes but only to spend approx £30m before May.

The Council continues to make savings of about £3.9m every year.

We are to invest in a project to improve Play Park equipment.

The Council will save £280,000 by signing a contract with FCC Environment to provide waste, recycling and cleaning services.

This financial year:

Work will take place in Ermington to provide new work units.

Money has been set aside to resurface car park areas.

We are looking at potential investment opportunities to deliver income.

We are considering a site for another supermarket, yet to be decided on.

The provision of a SW Mutual Bank is still going ahead.

5106 monies are being released for various projects.

Finally my 12 years as your District Councillor is coming to a close.

I have enjoyed trying to help where I could.

(c) Questions from the public and Councillors

A parishioner on behalf of themselves and others expressed concern that "The Mildmay Colours" has been shut for a period of time and is worried about its future. They asked if the Parish Council would support the building being listed as an Asset of Community Value (ACV). Councillors agreed they would support the building being registered as an ACV. Cllr Flower agreed to assist with submitting an application. ACTION: Cllr Flower



YEALMPTON AND BRIXTON MEN'S SHED PROJECT

The Men's Shed idea began in Australia 12 years ago and has now taken root in the UK

There are some 490 Shed's across Britain, with a further 145 in development. Shed's are community spaces for men to connect, converse and create and this national initiative is aimed at addressing the social needs of, often, lonely and older men, helping them to meet and interact with others, locally, by aiding them to use skills to benefit the community. Shed's help to reduce loneliness and isolation, but most importantly, they can be fun.

The Brixton and Yealmpton Shed opened last September, following 6 months planning by the Brixton and Yealmpton Community Association. We were offered space beneath the parish rooms without charge for the first year, and at our inaugural meeting in October we signed 24 members. We were given a grant by the parish council to purchase work benches and tools and further tools and equipment have been generously donated by local residents. Timber and materials as well as financial gifts have been donated by local business.

We have begun addressing some of the items on the Yealmpton parish council's wish list including repairing a bench in Bakery Square and another next to the bus stop. But we have no intention of competing with local business.

We are registered with the National Men's Shed organisation.

Our room on Torr Hill has been cleaned, decorated and re-wired, including fitting the latest workshop lighting. Currently we meet on Wednesday and Saturday mornings between 9.30 and midday and now have 26 members.

Our aim is to be financially self sufficient. We draw up an estimate of materials and time involved to do a project, ensuring the end user knows material costs and then we ask for a donation towards the time spent on the project.

We believe in promoting our services and are booked at the Yealmpton Show and the local school fair where we hope to sell some of the toys, bird boxes, garden planters and bee hotels we have made. We have also constructed a "mud kitchen" for the local primary school.

Members are invited to pay £12 per year subscription, due on the 1st April, and each member is asked to pay £1 per when using the Shed to cover tea, biscuits and incidentals. We will shortly run a health and safety and first aid course, and anyone wishing to use our machinery will be shown how to use such apparatus safely. We would welcome younger members to join us as well as women

We wish to maximise the use of our Men's Shed and invite neighbouring parishes to get involved. There are a further 5 days each week when the Shed is idle. Last November I attended the Men's Shed AGM at Worcester with some 200 like minded people. There were displays of what others enjoyed doing, including bicycle repairs, house and plaque signage, up-cycling old furniture, making children's toys, helping the local amateur dramatic group to make stage scenery, wood turning, garden planters, model hobbies, etc. The Isle of Wight Men's Shed is run entirely by women.

In a world where natural resources are finite, we currently extract some 70 billion tons of natural materials every year, predicted to reach 100 billion tons in the next 30 years. It's time to consider how we can repair and remake every day items, instead of throwing things away away. With just a little care and consideration, so much can be saved and reused.

Please come and see what we are doing. We looking at ways to help make a difference, whilst enjoying each other's company.
